Over time, Dev began to understand the real meaning of seva. It wasn't about charity or feeling sorry for others. It was about compassion, equality, and shared humanity. Whether it was helping a child learn to read or cleaning the shelter's courtyard, every small act mattered.

During a school debate on “What makes a good citizen?”, Dev confidently said, “A good citizen is someone who doesn’t wait for others to solve problems but becomes part of the solution.” His speech was met with thunderous applause.
